



**INSTRUCTIONS ON IMPLEMENTING  
A SURVEY OF THE SATISFACTION WITH STUDIES,  
EMPLOYABILITY, AND EMPLOYMENT AMONG GRADUATES OF UNIVERSITY OF MARIBOR**

**Št. XY/2013**

**I. AIMS AND OBJECTIVES**

Article 1  
(aim of the survey)

University of Maribor (hereinafter referred to as »UM«) positions the students in the center of its organisation and educational process. Within its system of monitoring and quality assurance, UM regularly collects and analyses information about education and competence of its students and graduates, and their employability, and employment.

We are uniformly defining ways and mechanisms for collecting information at the university level, by involving students and graduates. This assures us the basis for efficient management and implementation of study programmes and also makes us adaptive to the needs of relevant economic, social and cultural environment. All mentioned is the basis for improvement and updates of study programmes and their implementation.

UM is collecting information mentioned above, with:

1. Survey of the satisfaction with studies (Supplement 1),
2. Survey of employability and employment among graduates of UM (Supplement 2).

Basic aim of the Survey of the satisfaction with studies is to get a complete assessment of the content quality and implementation of each study programme, based on the opinion of students at the end of their studies, in each academic year. The survey will allow us to monitor study outcomes and acquired competences, important for:

- transition to the labour market, and employability of graduates,
- further education,
- monitoring satisfaction with the study,
- comparative analysis of competences – planned (study programme), achieved (at graduation), and expected or required (employer or current employment).

Basic aim of the Survey of employability and employment of graduates of UM is to collect data about their employability and employment in a year and a half, and in 5 years, for each study programme in each academic year, based on the opinion of graduates, about their acquired and required competences, which are important for:

- employability of graduates,
- competitiveness at the labour market,
- planning lifelong learning of graduates.

Both surveys are connected through some of the questions and represent a uniform monitoring of students while studying, till employability, and employment, and their career paths as graduates of UM.

Article 2  
(basic objectives)

Basic objectives of the Survey of the satisfaction with studies are to collect opinion of new graduates about:

- quality of study programme, and the organization and implementation of study process,
- supporting staff at the faculty (office for student affairs, library, etc.) and the management of the faculty,
- facilities and its equipment (library, computer and software equipment, accessibility),
- factors of satisfaction with study (average grade, willingness and quantity of work load, extracurricular activities, student exchange, internships abroad or in the field of study, the knowledge transfer),
- level of competences, gained by students (their own assessment) while studying, and competences they wished to acquire in a greater extent,
- factors of acquired competences while studying (average grade, willingness and quantity of work load, extracurricular activities, student exchange, internships abroad or in the field of studies, the knowledge transfer).

Basic objectives of the Survey of employability and employment of graduates of UM are to assure systematic monitoring of graduates of UM and collect information and their opinion about:

- time needed to find the first employment,
- type and suitability of employment, compared to the field of study and the academic degree,
- level of acquired and needed or necessary competences,
- possible reasons for being unable to find an employment.

Article 3

For the purpose of simplification, only the male form is used in these Instructions.

**II. IMPLEMENTATION OF THE SURVEYS**

Article 4  
(time of implementation and informing)

The survey of the satisfaction with studies is going to be implemented after the graduation or end of study at any level of studies. After the end of study is being entered in the program AIPS, it automatically summons the student to complete the survey.

A completed survey represents an obligation before the certificate of graduation/master's degree at second level of study/doctorate can be issued. When the survey is finished and verified the graduate gets an invitation to the alumni club of his faculty and to the alumni club of UM. Invitation is signed by the dean and includes an entry form, and a link to a home page of the alumni club.

Members of alumni club will receive an invitation to complete the survey of employability and employment of graduates of UM via e-mail, and in e-forms, year and a half and 5 years after graduation at a certain level of study.

Faculty is informing students and members of faculty staff with aims and objectives of both surveys with constant announcement on their web page.

Article 5  
(obligation to fulfilment of the survey, examiners)

Fulfilment of the survey of the satisfaction with studies is obligatory and anonymous for students.

All full-time and part-time students at first and second level of studies have the obligation to fulfil the survey's questionnaire, as well as students without student status, who wish to complete their study at University of Maribor.

Fulfilment of the questionnaire about employability and employment of graduates of UM, who become members of alumni club of their faculty, which also makes them members of alumni club UM, is not binding, but it is preferred.

Article 6  
(the way of surveying)

Both surveys are being implemented in e-forms, available on web pages of UM and in the program AIPs.

Computer centre of UM (hereinafter referred to as »RCUM«) is enabling an access to e-questionnaires. RCUM enables automatic summoning of students to fulfil the questionnaire in program AIPS. RCUM in cooperation with Career centre of UM summons the members of alumni club at faculties, who are also members of Alumni club UM, to fulfil the survey, while considering the terms for survey implementation.

Article 7  
(responsibility for implementation)

The dean of each faculty is responsible for implementation of the Survey of satisfaction with studies, and Career centre or Alumni club UM are responsible for the Survey of employability and employment of graduates of UM.

Article 8  
(the questionnaire)

Both surveys are the same to the defined extent and content, except in part, which is applied to competences. Faculty can add competences specific for various subjects, which are also listed in accredited study programmes to those listed as general competences.

When a student logs on the web page of the survey, he sees:

- Rector's foreword about the importance of the survey,
- the questionnaire,
- acknowledgment for cooperation, and when the questionnaire is completed also invitation from the Rector of UM to join Alumni club UM, and with that to alumni club of the faculty.

Article 9  
(monitoring the implementation of the surveys)

The implementation of surveys, the processing and the use of results and its content are being monitored by Student council of UM and Committee for Post-graduate Studies of the Senate of UM. If needed, they can propose the changes or adaptations of these instructions and both questionnaires,

### III. PROCESSING AND USE OF RESULTS

Article 10  
(processing)

RCUM is in charge of processing both surveys for all the faculties. They perform the basic statistical processing, which is enabled by information support system of UM, and sends the results to the faculties after the end of surveying for a specific academic year, in one month time at the latest.

While processing the arithmetic middles and standard deviation for each question, and relative frequencies in % for each study programme, are being calculated. Responses to open questions are collected for each study programme. Collected responses of graduates of each faculty are forwarded in an electronic table to each faculty for their own analysis and planning.

Article 11  
(use of results)

Results of both surveys are accessible to each faculty, to management of UM, to Quality Assessment Committee, to Career centre of UM, and to Centre for quality assurance of UM, and are used for evaluation processes, accreditation processes, reaccreditation processes and other activities whose purpose is to improve quality of educational activity at UM.

Career Centre of UM and Centre of quality assurance of UM are involved in processing, interpretation and use of results, and they propose changes and supplementations of these instructions.

#### **IV. STORAGE OF RESULTS**

Article 12  
(storage of results)

All results are stored electronically in RCUM's database.

#### **V. TRANSITIONAL AND FINAL PROVISIONS**

Article 13  
(supplement)

Questionnaires of both surveys are components of these instructions.

Article 14  
(different possibilities of own monitoring employability and employment of graduates)

Faculties can implement their own surveys, parallel to the surveys defined with these instructions, and gather additional information, if needed.

Faculties can also maintain the existing ways of obtaining members for their alumni clubs or associations and still be entitled to gaining information of members form Alumni club UM.

Article 15  
(entry into force)

These instructions shall enter into force on the day following the Senate of the University of Maribor adopts them.

Surveys can start being experimentally implemented after the electronic access is establish on the web page of UM, and are obligatory for all faculties to implement in the academic year 2013/2014 or when they get their first graduates.
