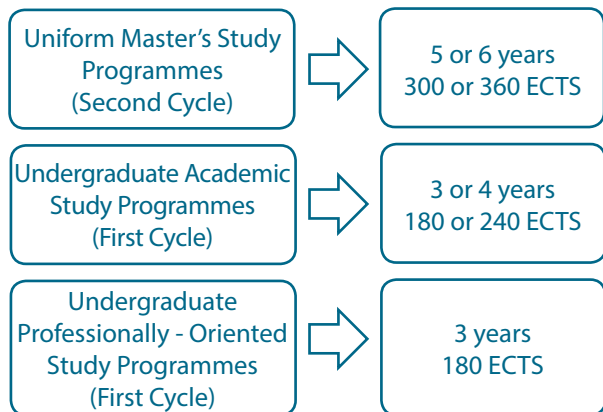

1. STUDYING AT THE UNIVERSITY OF MARIBOR

The University of Maribor is a broad-based institution committed to both excellence in education and extension of knowledge through basic and applied research. By offering degree programmes in social sciences, economics, humanities, medicine, natural sciences, educational sciences, law, engineering and arts the University promotes cooperation, competition and multidisciplinary.

2. APPLICATION AND ENROLMENT

Foreign citizens and Slovenians without Slovene citizenship can apply for enrolment in the 1st year of undergraduate study programmes in the period **from 5th February to 31st May 2014:**

Citizens of the EU countries have the right to education at higher education institutions in the Republic of Slovenia under the same conditions, under the same procedure and under the same deadlines as Slovenian citizens.

3. GENERAL REQUIREMENTS FOR ENROLMENT IN THE 1ST YEAR OF UNDERGRADUATE STUDY PROGRAMMES

Foreign citizens and Slovenians without Slovene citizenship can enrol in the first year of undergraduate study programmes if they meet the following requirements:

- completed **secondary education**;
- knowledge of Slovenian (see point 5);
- **completed recognition procedure** for secondary-school certificates obtained abroad (see point 7);
- **completed test of specific aptitudes, abilities and skills.**

4. PROOF OF MEETING ADMISSION REQUIREMENTS

- notarised copy of citizenship certificate;
- translation of citizenship certificate into Slovene by a court translator;
- verified copies of the secondary school certificates (secondary school exit certificate and certificates of the last two years);
- translation of copies of secondary school exit certificate and certificates of the last two years by a court translator;
- decision on recognition of certificates obtained abroad (see point 7);
- a Slovenian language certificate (see point 5).

5. KNOWLEDGE OF SLOVENIAN

Since all courses at the University of Maribor are conducted in Slovenian, knowledge of Slovenian is recommended.

Faculties that require a Slovene language certificate:

before enrolment in the first year of undergraduate study programmes:

- Faculty of Education, with the exception of programme Music Education (I);
- Faculty of Arts (I);
- Faculty of Medicine (*).

before enrolment in the second year of undergraduate study programmes:

- Faculty of Mechanical Engineering (B);
- Faculty of Law (B);
- Faculty of Education (programme Music Education) (I);
- Faculty of Health Sciences (B);

I – intermediate level; B – basic level;

- * All candidates need a Slovenian language certificate of level C2, regarding the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages (CEFR). As a fulfilled enrolment condition is considered a taken exam of Slovenian language at final exam (Slovenian matura), certificate of last year the subject was carried out at secondary school, certificate of Slovenian language of level C2 or other equivalent document.

Other faculties **do not require a Slovene language certificate** for enrolment in undergraduate study programmes (Faculty of Electrical Engineering and Computer Science, Faculty of Civil Engineering, Faculty of Logistics, Faculty of Energy Technology, Faculty of Natural Sciences and mathematics, Faculty of Economics and Business, Faculty of Organizational Sciences, Faculty of Agriculture and Life Sciences, Faculty of Chemistry and Chemical Engineering, Faculty of Tourism, Faculty of Criminal Justice).
